“Thank-you for your support and contribution to our Live in the Woods show,” says PLC President, Jeff Wimer. “It was my intent to find a spot that would allow us to showcase all of the latest in logging technology. This was the first show that included tether assist, drone and cable logging. It was fun to see the expression on the students’ faces when they first walked out and looked over the edge between the yarder and tethered assist. One even said, “It was like you were sitting on top of the world”.

Jeff was also excited to have the OR OSHA regulators attend the show. Watching the machines in action got a dialog started between them that he

hoped would continue after the show and help create more workable rules for our entire industry.

This year, the PLC focused on bringing high school students to the show to introduce them to career opportunities and pathways into our industry. This year students were not only provided talented, volunteer tour guides to take them through the show, but a photo of their class, taken by a drone, to remember the show by.

New PLC President – Don Banasky

At the PLC dinner and auction, the ace was passed from President Jeff Wimer to PLC's new president, Don Banasky, from Ladysmith, British Columbia. For those of you who haven't had a chance to meet Don in person, here's a little background.

Don began his career with an entrepreneurial spirit as President of Untamed Industries Inc. providing customers with a variety of labor-related services. In 1994, he joined TimberWest Forest Corp. and gained experience as a chokerman, rigging slinger, hooktender, and a mechanical processor operator. In 2002, along with Bryan Gregson he launched FallTech Logging Ltd., which provided mechanical falling and bunching services of upwards of 424 MBFT. At this time, he also began D. Banasky Logging Consultants Ltd., which focused on project management, safety and systems development, team building and training in the forest industry and still runs this company to this day providing deactivation work and consulting.

In 2011, FallTech Logging Ltd. was purchased by The Gregson Group where Don provided consulting and management services to both companies. Don acted as Operations Manager for Copcan Contracting Ltd.; involved in estimating, project and systems management, strategic business development and safety implementation.

Don also served as a Director of Practicum Placement at Vancouver Island University and sits on numerous industry committees including the Steep Slope Advisory Committee and the Incident investigation Advisory Committee. In 2013, he was awarded the BC Forest Safety Council MVP Safety Award. Don is also the recipient of the Canadian Medal of Bravery.

In 2013, Don was a guest of the Forest industry Safety Accord in the United Kingdom where he was invited to view and comment of the forest industry there, as a result of excessive injuries and deaths. Don gave safety presentations in community auditoriums and in the woods throughout the country. This



same year he was invited to speak at the Forest Industry Safety Summit in Rotorua.

Don was on the TLA Board of Directors and served as president in 2014 and 2015.

Don is currently Vice President of Western Canadian Timber Products Ltd. — a tenure holder that performs all phases of logging and forestry.

The PLC looks forward to a great year under his leadership.
